**Suggested Spiritual Preparation** 

The 54-day Rosary Novena Spiritual preparation begins on Wednesday August 15<sup>th</sup> the Feast of the Assumption. You are invited to pray your daily Rosary with great fervor in Reparation for your own sins, the sins of your family and for the sins of the nations of the British Isles.

#### Rosary under the Cross

In the silence of Mary let us gather and kneel under the Cross of

Christ and with Mary embrace the Cross of our times, console Jesus crucified and plead for God's Mercy.

God's Mercy will again flow when we Repent - "This is the time of fulfilment. The kingdom of Heaven is at hand. Repent and believe in the Gospel!" Mk 1v15

## Suggested Programme for October 7th

(You are welcome to form your own -this is a guideline. A programme booklet will be provided)

Sunday Mass in the morning.

**Display a CROSS** (large or small) in the center of your chosen venue for you to gather around.

"Ecce Cruces Domini, augite pastes adverse – Behold the Cross of the Lord, flee you enemy powers!"

#### Make opportunity for the Sacrament of Confession

2.30/2.45pm Gather in penitential **SILENCE** before the Cross, in your Parish Church or other venue.

3pm Pray the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary in Reparation for your own sins and the sins of Families, Parishes, Church, Communities and Nation. (Meditations would be pre prepared by us)

3.30pm In **England**, **Mary's Dowry** - Invocation of Litany of Our Lady of Walsingham, English Saints and Martyrs and the prayer for England

**In Wales** - Invocation of Litany of Our Lady of Cardigan/Pehrhys, Welsh Saints and Martyrs and the prayer for Wales

**In Scotland** - Invocation of Litany of Our Lady of Scotland, Scottish Saints and Martyrs and the prayer for Scotland

# In the various Isles - Invocation of local Litany of Our Lady, local Saints and Martyrs etc along with the above.

Gentle song ...

3.45pm –Pray the prayer of Confession of the Prophet Daniel followed by solemn, silent time of prayer before the Cross, in repentance and in reparation for the sins of Nations. A time to kneel, to place our heads on the ground, to bow before the Lord and confess, lament, acknowledge and apologize for our sins as Nations and as a Church.

Hymn – Who Can Sound the Depths of Sorrow in the Father Heart of God or other such hymn.

4pm After 5 minutes of total silence– Priest to lead the solemn National Act of Prayer of Repentance – This will be sent you

4.15pm Lift High the Cross & Solemn Silent Procession with the

Holy Cross either inside or outside around your Church/Shrine/Venue

Hymn - God of Mercy & Compassion

If possible - Short time of Adoration followed by Benediction in your local Church

4.30pm Finish
